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2. STUDENT REGISTRATION

- What is a pin #?
 The alternate pin # is your six-digit birthdate MM/DD/YY
- When are courses available?
 Most graduate courses are offered both spring and fall semesters (theory and clinical).
 Look up course offerings.
- What hours are the courses available?

All graduate nursing courses are offered during the **evenings** Monday through Thursday beginning at 5pm. Most of the courses are face to face or hybrid and a few fully online.

What courses do I begin with?
 DNP students NUR 7300 Scientific Foundation for Nursing, and/ NUR 7320- Information Systems Management.

BSN-MSN-DNP students NUR **5001** *Theoretical Foundations*, and/ NUR **5461**- *Adv*. *Pathophysiology*. If you can only enroll in one course, register for NUR 5001 where an orientation and other resources are discussed as you move forward in your graduate studies.

- When can I register?

- How do I know I am cleared for a clinical course?

 If, all preceptor documentation is confirmed and completed. Log onto Exxat, and check to see if all documents that needed to be uploaded, have been approved.
- How do I check my clinical health clearance?

 Log onto Exxat and check the status of the documents uploaded. You will see pending review, approved, and not approved. Exxat will provide comments if documents are pending and/or not approved.

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3. TRANSFER CREDIT POLICY

A **maximum** of up to 49% **credits** from other institutions may be credited toward a master's degree program provided that:

- 1) Student applies for transfer credit at the time of matriculation
- 2) Work was taken in graduate courses for graduate credit
- 3) Work was taken within the last six years
- 4) Grade received was B or better
- 5) Work does not duplicate any work, graduate or undergraduate, for which credit was previously given
- 6) Work was not applied toward an academic degree at any other institution
- 7) Work was taken at an accredited college or university; and
- 8) Work is applicable to the student's program.

A current matriculated William Paterson University student may, in some instances, be allowed to take courses off-campus at other institutions as a visiting student and transfer the credit to William Paterson University. The student must receive permission from the dean of the college and/or the department chairperson of his/her program of study prior to course registration. These credits are allowed as transfer credit; provisions two through six as stated above remain applicable in such instances.

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4. DOCTOR OF NURSING PRACTICE

The Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) is a practice doctorate that prepares advanced practice nurses to be clinical scholars and thought leaders. The DNP program will prepare nurses with knowledge and skills to deliver the highest standard of care for individuals, families, communities and work in interdisciplinary teams in today's complex healthcare system. The Doctor of Nursing Practice Program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) 655 K Street NW, Suite 750, Washington, DC 20001, Telephone (202) 887-6791, until June 30, 2030.

The Post Masters DNP curriculum includes 41 credit hours that can be completed in seven semesters (two courses per semester). Course work includes: utilizing technology to advance the quality of care; evaluating health care policy; providing leadership and inter-professional collaboration in multiple health care settings; and evaluating systems responses to health and illness, along with knowledge of nursing theories, related sciences, humanities and economics. Students must also complete a minimum of 1,000 supervised post Baccalaureate practice hours.

Upon successful completion of the DNP, graduates will be able to:

- Provide advanced nursing care to individuals, families, communities, and clinical populations
- Appraise and utilize current technologies to advance the quality and accessibility of care
- Critique and selectively translate science to guide clinical decision-making and program development
- Evaluate and influence health care policy and systems
- Provide leadership and inter-professional collaboration in multiple health care arenas
- Evaluate systems responses to health and illness as a basis for the promotion, restoration, and maintenance of health and functional abilities and the prevention of illness
- Integrate advanced knowledge of nursing theories, related sciences and humanities, and methods or inquiry
- Initiate changes in the healthcare system through the design and implementation of health related projects that strengthen the outcomes in the healthcare delivery system

^{*}This course is highly recommended for students who are seeking financial aid and need to have a minimum of 6 credits/term. This course is not required for graduation. DNP students are encouraged to enroll in an education course since they will be eligible to teach in a school of nursing program. This course is required for students on the Nurse Faculty Loan Program.

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6. BSN-MSN-DNP

In this program, nurses with a BSN are provided with a path to seamlessly obtain both their MSN and DNP degree. After applying to the program, the nursing student would complete the courses required for the MSN degree in one of two tracks: 1) adult-gerontology nurse practitioner in primary care (**AGNP**) or 2) Family nurse practitioner (**FNP**) and will then be eligible for the nurse practitioner national certification examinations. The MSN curriculum includes two DNP courses. Upon completion of the MSN, the student is admitted seamlessly into the DNP program, which prepares nurses with the highest level of scientific knowledge and practice expertise to assure the best quality of care and provide positive patient outcomes.

The adult gerontology nurse practitioner (AGNP) track consists of 39 credits in the MSN and 32 credits in the DNP for a total of 71 credits. This can be completed as a full-time or part-time student. To provide flexibility for working nurses, the program includes two courses per semester where one is fully online and other is hybrid. Upon completion of the theory and practicum course requirements, you would be eligible to apply for the Adult Gerontology Nurse Practitioner in Primary Care Certification examination by American Association of Nurse Practitioner (AANP) or American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC).

The **family nurse practitioner** (**FNP**) track consists of 47 credits in the MSN and 32 credits in the DNP for a total of **79 credits**. This can be completed as a **full-time** or **part-time** student. To provide flexibility for working nurses, the program includes two courses per semester where one is fully online and other is hybrid. FNPs provide comprehensive primary health care services to individuals from infancy through adulthood. FNPs are prepared to provide care to individuals with acute and chronic illnesses. Preventive health services, patient education, disease management, and illness prevention are provided within the context of family and community. Upon completion of the theory and practicum course requirements, you would be eligible to apply for the Family Nurse Practitioner Certification examination by American Association of Nurse Practitioner (AANP) or American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC).

- For both tracks (AGNP & FNP) the pre-requisite courses for NUR 6041 clinical practicum include completion of the graduate core, 3 P's (6001-adv. health assessment, 5461-adv. Patho, 6011-adv. Pharm) and at least one of the advanced nursing specialization courses.
- In addition to the supervised clinical hours, a 2 ½ hour seminar (face to face/online/hybrid) will be held bi-weekly during the semester

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10. CLINICAL PRECEPTOR INFORMATION

- 1) Student must be authorized by their advisor to take a clinical course
- 2) Student must be <u>registered</u> for a clinical course (MSN: NUR 6041, NUR 7011, NUR 7070, NUR 7252, 7253, 7254, 7255, DNP: NUR 8350, NUR 8351, NUR 8360, NUR 8361)

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- 3) Fill out MSN Student and Preceptor Information Request forms.

 DNP Preceptor Information Request forms complete on Exxat. Deadlines for both (MSN & DNP):
 Fall Semester May 31, Spring Semester Oct 31, Summer Semester March 31
 - All preceptors need to have their cv/resume on file. If the preceptor's cv/resume is not on file, a copy will need to be uploaded in Exxat. For MSN student, make sure NP preceptor includes their certification and expiration date for AANC or AANP on their cv/resume. If this is not provided, the request will not be approved until the preceptor updates their cv/resume with the appropriate information.
- 4) The coordinators will review and approve/deny submissions. The student will be notified through Exxat when requests are approved/denied or if further information is required
- 5) Student must fulfill health clearance requirements (student compliance) in Exxat by due date listed for each semester, listed on Graduate Nursing website under clinical track forms.
 All clinical clearance documentation requirements are due 14 days prior to the start of the clinical course. *If a student is not cleared 7 days prior to the start of the first day of their clinical course, they will be administratively dropped without warning. NO EXCEPTIONS
- 6) Fill out <u>initial health clearance</u> form or <u>re-clearance health form on Exxat</u>. *Physicals must be completed annually*
- 7) MSN & DNP student must complete **background check** with <u>Universal (on Exxat)</u>. *Background checks must be completed annually*. Rechecks are only done when the initial check is going to/has expired.
- 8) MSN & DNP student must complete **background check** with <u>Universal (on Exxat)</u>. *Background checks must be completed annually*. Rechecks are only done when the initial check is going to/has expired.
- 9) How do I obtain a preceptor? (MSN and DNP students) Students must obtain a preceptor on their own. They can seek out sites and/or practices with an NP or MD. Tips for finding a preceptor

MSN - NP students: A minimum of at least one clinical practicum must be precepted by a Nurse Practitioner (MSN NUR 7252 & 7253 MUST be with an NP preceptor).

NP students DO NOT CHOOSE: A specialty focused practice, such as: hematology, oncology, surgery, respiratory health, etc. These practices do not provide the diversity of young adult, adult and older adult health problems required for certification. Emergency Departments are not appropriate for practicums.

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Clinical Requirements for MSN - NP Students

- Collecting patient histories and performing physical examinations on young adults, adults and older adults; (NUR 7070 pediatrics and childbearing women).
- Identifying normal vs. abnormal findings in these populations.
- Recognizing and identifying common health problems of young adults, adults and older adults;
 (NUR 7070 pediatrics and childbearing women); that can be of an acute, transient nature and chronic health problems)
- Developing and implementing management plans that include appropriate diagnostics and proposed treatment approaches.
- Prioritizing, organizing, managing and evaluating patient's health care.
- Settings where young adults, adults and older adults, (NUR 7070 (MSN students) pediatrics and childbearing women) receive health care are therefore an essential part of selecting a site. Your first site (NUR 6041- MSN students) would ideally emphasize enough history and physical exams to establish confidence. Helpful settings might include Employee Health Services, Assisted Living Facilities, Nursing Homes, or Occupational Health departments in businesses or institutions.
- Consider settings that offer guaranteed opportunities to practice with young adult, adult and older adult clients, (NUR 7070 pediatric and childbearing women); and within that category, these patients/clients should be represented: male and female patients with common health problems (acute and chronic), female patients with female specific health issues (GYN/GU). Settings might include: Internal Medicine Offices, Outpatient Medical Clinics, etc.; (NUR 7070 pediatrician offices/clinics, Obstetric offices/clinics, etc.).
- White lab coats are required for all MSN & DNP students in clinical practica. Contact Flynn

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Guidelines for DNP Clinical Practicum in the DNP Program

The DNP Practicum courses (NUR 8350, 8351, 8360, 8361) will serve to provide an in-depth advanced clinical experience for students. A total of 360 clinical hours are earned in these courses. This advanced practicum will provide the opportunity to gain advanced clinical skills, link policy making with clinical systems, translate research into practice and/or serve as change agents for health care. The student will show achievement of comprehension and application of the eight AACN DNP Essentials (2021). Completion of the minimum 1,000 supervised clinical practice hours is mandated by the American Association of Colleges of Nursing. A variety of clinical experiences can be obtained. Time spent and clinical mentor/preceptor/agency objectives related to the DNP essentials.

All DNP students at William Paterson University will complete at least 1,000 precepted clinical hours post-BSN. Clinical hours earned in your master's program will be taken into consideration upon admission. (If you earned a MSN in nursing education, the number of clinical hours cannot be counted toward the 1,000 hours).

Calculation of Clinical Hours: Each student must submit official documentation of the number of precepted clinical hours completed in the MSN or post MSN program.

- 1. Independent related clinical hours:
 - Several of the courses have optional clinical hours as part of their course (NUR 7320, 7300, 7340, 7360, and 7380) related to the DNP Essentials, e.g. attendance at scholarly conferences, for these clinical experiences students must have prior approval and submit the practice experience self-reflection to either the professor in the course or the student's DNP coordinator. The practice experience self-reflection can be found on page 74. The experience must also be logged in the student's clinical hour log.
- 2. All students who enroll in the clinical course (NUR 8350, 8351, 8360, 8361) must have an approved clinical preceptor and are required to complete the Clinical Documentation Checklist prior to the beginning of their clinical experiences. Additional health requirements may be required depending upon the health care setting and/or agency. It is the student's responsibility to find out these requirements e.g. HIPAA, agency orientations, etc. prior to beginning the clinical courses.

We have three graduation dates for the **on-campus program**: January 25 (fall), May 25 (spring), and September 1 (summer). For **WP Online program** we have six graduation dates: November 1 (fall-1), January 25 (fall-2), April 1 (spring-1), May 25 (spring-2), and July 31 (summer-1), September 1 (summer-2). In order for a student to graduate, they must fulfill their requirements, such as, complete all their credits in their major, satisfy financial obligations, and apply for graduation. Any student who misses the deadline can apply for the next semester's graduation. Disregard the comprehensive requirement as this does not apply to nursing students. Diplomas and official transcripts will not be available until 4-6 weeks after the graduation date (degree conferral date).


