Chapter 1 Thesis Paper Rubric

The purpose of this final project is to apply the knowledge and skills you have learned in this class to create Chapter 1 of your research thesis. Included in Chapter One will be the identification of a research topic, development of a research question, rationale and background needed for the thesis.

Listed below are the basic components for the first chapter needed for class.

1. Title Page (5 points)

2. Table of Contents Page (5 points)

3. Chapter 1: Introduction: Minimum of 10 pages and no longer than 15 pages all inclusive. All papers need to include these following second level topic headings.

A. Statement of the Problem – (15 points)

- Succinctly state the problem that your thesis is going to address.
- Present relevant information about why this is important.
- Does the problem pose significance for education?
- Will the problem present the data that explains previously unexplained facts?
- Will the problem serve as a point of departure for the project or study?

B. Background and Need. (25 points)

The background is used to introduce your topic or subject. In general terms, it explains what your study will address. Things to keep in mind when writing the background and need.

- Why is this important area?
- What has been the historical development of the topic?
- Have there been significant investigations, studies, or reports concerning the topical area?
- What is the current status of the area of your interest?
- Use citations throughout to support your study.

C. Purpose of the Project: Based on the above background information, explain the purpose of the study. Explain what you are going to accomplish and why you chose to do it. The statement of the problem might begin with the words, "The problem of the study is...." Or "This project will address the problem of..." or "This project will answer these questions. This section should only be one or two paragraphs in length. **(15 points)**

D. Research Questions/Hypothesis (15 points)

- Given the background above, you carefully state the hypothesis (ses) that will be tested in your thesis
- Can you answer your questions in a 6 month research study?

- Are the questions too narrow or too broad? Meaning can your questions is answered by using a survey, some type of program that allows for comparison of groups, modifications using some type of statistical measurement?
- E. Limitations/Delimitations not needed for this class
- F. Definition of Terms not needed for this class
- G. References (20 points)

Have you followed APA guidelines? Are your references the same font as your narrative?

(Do you have a minimum of 15 references?)
