

**Addendum to  
3+1 Comprehensive Partnership Agreement between  
Mercer County Community College and William Paterson University**

The purpose of this addendum is to incorporate additional information into the Three Plus One Comprehensive Partnership Agreement between **Mercer County Community College** and **William Paterson University**. This addendum details the transfer of students enrolled in the associates' degrees in Liberal Arts, offered by the Liberal Arts Division, or Public Health, offered by the Health Professions Division, at **Mercer County Community College** into the baccalaureate degree in Disability Studies offered by the Department of Special Education, Professional Counseling, and Disability Studies in the College of Education at **William Paterson University**.

This agreement shall become effective on August 1, 2020 and shall remain in effect until modified by mutual consent or altered one year after receipt of written intention by either party.




