

MOVE-IN GUIDE

What is Provided

Furniture in each bedroom/bathroom -

- bed with extra-long twin mattress; a closet or wardrobe; personal desk and chair; window shades or curtains and a shower curtain.

Furniture in each apartment -

- couch, dining table with 4 chairs, full size refrigerator and stove

Each room features -

- WiFi connectivity, tile or vinyl floors, heat and AC capabilities, and a wall light per room.

Each building/area features -

- Vending machines, app-enabled washers and dryers (no cost), lounge space and mailboxes for each resident

Room Dimensions

Century Hall

- Rooms are 12'11" x 18'10"

High Mountain East & High Mountain West

- Rooms vary in size (approx 200 sq. ft to 290 sq. ft)

Hillside Hall

- Rooms are 12' x 18'10"

Skyline Hall

- Rooms are 11' x 18'

Heritage & Pioneer Apartments

- Bedrooms are 10' x 17'6"

Move In Clearance

Before coming to campus, all students need to verify that they are cleared to move in.

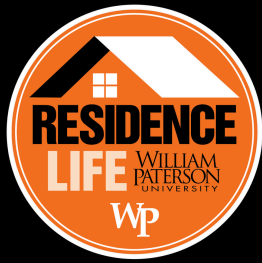
Students must be registered for classes for the current semester and must be compliant/cleared for Meningitis by Counseling, Health and Wellness before they will be permitted to move in.

Move-In Tips from former students & parents

- Create a packing list
- Coordinate with roommate/suitemate on who will bring shared items
- If possible, bring only seasonal clothing
- Pack small items in larger boxes or bins for easier transport to your room
- Label your items and bins with student name, building and room number
- Bring a hand truck to help bring heavier items closer/into the building
- Have your University student ID close at hand for check-in
- Shopping is available locally to buy toiletries, food, cleaning items and decor leaving more room in the car for other items
- Consider using a trunk as a small table in the room or as storage under your bed

Prohibited Items - What not to bring

- Alcohol and alcohol containers. Alcohol is only permitted in Pioneer and Heritage Halls for students who are 21 years or older.
- Candles - including decorative, scented, wickless, and incense that is lit or heated
- Electric heaters
- Appliances with exposed burners or warmers
- Grills, Camping stoves, George Foreman Grills
- Air Fryers
- Deep Fryers
- Halogen lights or lamps
- Smoking and smoking devices in the halls such as pipes, cigarettes, hookahs, cigars, electronic cigarettes
- Pets, including all fish and aquarium reptiles
- Neon signs
- Live trees or large plants
- Oil lamps, lava lamps
- Weapons or Dangerous Objects of any kind
- Fireworks, Combustible liquids
- Hoverboards or electric scooters
- Add'l furniture, waterbeds, or your own mattress

Setting Up Your Room

The following guidelines establish standards that comply with safety, fire, and maintenance policies. Even with these limitations, residents have decorated amazing rooms and personalized the rooms to their tastes.

- Posters should be attached to walls with removable no damage products
- Hanging sheets, wallpaper or other objects from the walls/ceiling is not permitted.
- Lamps cannot be draped with any material, as this is a serious fire hazard.
- All window treatments provided by the University are flame retardant, and should not be removed or modified.
- Only authorized University employees may make changes to the electrical system and wiring in the residence halls.
- Locks cannot be installed on room doors, closet doors, bathroom doors, or desk/dresser drawers.
- Room furniture must be set up to allow egress from room door to window.
- Area rugs brought in should be bound on edges and rated for fire safety.
- Painting of the rooms by residents is not permitted. Concerns regarding existing painted walls should be brought forward as a Work Order, submitted to your hall office or as an online request.
