Neici –

The MEd in Special Ed does bring up a question, though not an objection.

The two major modifications are to reduce the number of required credits and to do away with the research thesis component. However, one of the "senior" level courses is precisely on research - acknowledged, together with leadership, as vital for these professionals in their careers. There is a logical disconnect in how this is stated - eliminating a research project but continuing to teach research. Perhaps there is a clearer way of saying that the research component is being incorporated into a course rather than being a stand-alone project? Or maybe that the new course will be more closely tied to the fieldwork that these professionals will undertake in the future?

**CLARIFICAITON needed :** Research thesis – requirement for how much is paid – prohibits students from taking this mater's degree but want to emphasize how to present peer-reviewed / not to write it

Practitioner focused research instead

Kem – which 9 credits were deleted?- rework the chart to clarify what is current and is being replaced with – submit course outlines for the new courses
