- Discussion/Action Items
  - Short description of available technology and online resources
    - Tao started a document with a list of available programs and online resources to highlight. This is to provide a quick review of some programs or resources from a user's perspective.
    - Council members suggested adding Zoom, Qualtrics, Honorlock, and a few more that are included in the ITwiki.
    - Council members suggested sending this document out in summer now that all summer classes are online.
    - Council members suggested referring to previous Instruction and Research Technology and Center for Teaching Excellence emails for consistency and continuity.

  - Update on 2019-2020 charges

    - Tao reported that collaboration with RSCE council had no new update and suggested removing this charge and replaced it with a charge to explore collaboration with other councils and committees, such as Technology Across the Curriculum, the Digital Liberal Arts Collaboratory, and others.
